

The 2014 funding model placed Catalonia in **3rd position in terms of per capita tax contributed to the State and 10th in resources received by the central government**

Catalonia contributes 17.6% more than the average autonomous community and, once the funding model is applied, **it receives 2% less from the State**

The current model encourages an arbitrary redistribution of resources

Communities with a much lower fiscal capacity than the State average have received more resources per capita than Catalonia

From 2009 until 2012, Catalonia was the third autonomous region in the amount it paid, but the tenth in the amount it received

In 2013 it was the second in the amount it paid and tenth in the amount it received

In 2014 it returned to being in the third and tenth position, respectively



€1,55 billion: 2 years overdue

In 2014, the State transferred 1.55 billion less than the amount owed from the revenue collected during the fiscal year. This amount was not received until 2016

Between 2010 and 2014, **the State received an additional 25.15 billion euros in tax revenues (VAT, Income Tax and Special Taxes) none of which went to the Autonomous Communities**
