In conjunction with the local community, the Government wants to **build a digital society** that goes beyond a mere collection of initiatives put forward by various administrations.

## What's expected from its implementation?

- ➔ The so-called information society represents a truly social, economic and cultural revolution akin to the industrial revolution of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. **It is the digital revolution.**
- ➔ In a society that is **more connected than ever**, electronic communications will be the new strategic infrastructures.
- ➔ Our ever-changing society thus requires a more open and innovative Administration.
- ➔ Due to the interrelations and dependency of our electronic communications and digital services, protection from cyber-attacks is paramount in a digital society.
- ➔ Productive activity must also be directed towards digital knowledge, this being the main resource for Catalan businesses in the global market.

## The National Plan for a Digital Society

### Objectives, courses of action and management bodies

- ➔ **Work together in a consensual manner** with all those who want to contribute to:
  - The deployment of the **SmartCAT strategy**.
  - The development and coordinated management of **technological infrastructures** and electronic communications.
  - The implementation of measures and technologies to enhance **cyber-security and protect the rights of people and businesses**.
  - A new **digital Administration**.
  - The development of **industry 4.0 and digitalisation**.
- ➔ **Invite other institutions** that wish to add to the scope and content of the Agreement.
- ➔ **Create joint working groups** in each area defined in the National Agreement.
- ➔ **Establish a monitoring commission** to follow up on the Agreement's progress.
