Mobility outside the residence should be limited as much as possible.



Telework when possible.



Meetings and gatherings of more than 6 people are still prohibited.



Beauty treatment services are prohibited, except for hairdressing services.



Max. 30% of the total capacity is allowed per license or authorization of the activity.

Excluding retail establishments of food, beverages, hygiene products, basic necessities, pharmacies, orthopedics, opticians and veterinary centers, which must reduce their total capacity by 50%.



Establishments with a +400 m² surface area have capacity and access controls.



Shopping centers have a capacity control system in common areas, and restricted access in recreational areas.



Religious and civil ceremonies must limit attendance to 50% of their capacity.



Public transport maintains its offer at 100%. Schedule restrictions can only occur at night.



Cultural activities reduce their capacity by 50%, seats are pre-assigned and closing time is at 11p.m.



Recreational sports facilities/equipment max. 50% of capacity. Unsupervised facilities are not to be used.



All non-professional sport competitions are postponed.



Amusement parks and fairs are not allowed to open to the public.



Public parks and gardens as well as children's play areas close at 8 p.m.



Gambling halls, casinos and bingo halls are not allowed to open to the public.



Bars and restaurants do not be open to the public (Only home delivery service or pick-up at the establishment by appointment. Hotel restaurants can open for hotel guests).



In hotel establishments, the capacity of the common areas is limited to 50%.



In universities, master classes are online.



In-person celebration of congresses, conventions, trade fairs and major festivals is suspended.



Non-sedentary markets can maintain their activity with a capacity of 30%.
